

Requirements to be a DGEMS Volunteer

- Schedule yourself using our online scheduling system for a minimum of 24 hours per month.
- Attend one training night per month – held on the fourth Monday of each month
- Maintain a valid driver's license
- Maintain your EMT licensure as needed – the in-house monthly training provides the minimum hours needed to renew your license every two years.
- Assist with daily duties around the station if you are on shift.
- Ability to make it down to the station in a timely fashion when called.
- Have fun!

Benefits to being a DGEMS Volunteer

- Uniforms provided
- Pagers provided to carry while on shift
- Shift stipend paid once per month
- Participation in events involving police and fire departments
- Give back to your community when the citizens need it most

The items listed above for requirements and benefits are not intended to be all-inclusive as we perform many tasks throughout the year in our communities. Any questions regarding requirements and benefits should be asked of the volunteer coordinator when they reply back to your application.

Applications may not be acted on immediately, and may be held for up to a year depending on the needs of the service. You may contact the volunteer coordinator at any time for an update on our selection timeline and the next volunteer orientation process.
